## Materials:

## 1) Oil paints

Recommended brands: Gamblin and Utrecht, from online stores; DickBlick.com, Utrecht.com, Jerrysartarama.com, and CheapJoes.com Look for sales which occur often!
Required Oil Colors: Titanium White (cool)
Lemon Yellow or Hansa Yellow (cool yellow)
Cadmium Yellow Medium or Indian Yellow (warm yellow)
Cadmium Red Light (warm red)
Quinacridone Red or Alizarin Crimson (cool red)
Manganese Blue Hue or Cerulean Blue (cool blue)
Ultramarine Blue (warm blue)
Additional and optional colors that you may want to add to your palette, especially *
Transparent Earth (oxide) Red* Burnt Sienna* Burnt Umber* Dioxazine Purple*
Quinacridone Magenta Cadmium Orange Cobalt blue Yellow ochre Chromatic Black
2) Palette: a disposable paper palette....approximately 9"X 12" with a Masterson Covered palette or invest in a glass palette to fit the Masterson Covered Palette.
3) Brushes: long handle -Flat brushes sizes \#2, \#4, \#8 and any additional sizes you desire (some artists like bristle brushes and others like softer Taklon or nylon brushes)
Rigger brush (narrow, long soft bristle brush) any size or a small round brush \#4 Cheap 1, $11 / 2$, 2 inch raw wooden handled, paint brush set from Walmart, sold in a plastic bag -in the art materials/crafts section of the store.
4) Canvas Boards size 11 " $\times 14$ " or 9 " $\times 12$ " or stretched canvases of any size.
5) Gamsol Odorless Solvent in a container with a tight-fitting lid.
6) Palette knife: a small palette knife for mixing paint.
7) Same 1 inch --3-ring Binder: A place to put the instructional handouts and photos. You will be able to refer to this later when you are painting on your own.... like having your own textbook.
8) Latex or Nitril gloves are optional, but are a good safety measure.
